

Your guide to job titles in Strong Interest Inventory® reports



As the newly launched Strong Interest Inventory® reports are written in US English, you may come across some unfamiliar job titles in the 'Occupational Scales' section. Whilst the majority of job titles listed will match what is used in the UK or be self-explanatory, you may wish to clarify what some of these jobs would be called in the UK.

The following table provides a key to UK equivalents of the job titles affected.

NB American spellings are not listed, only those terms where whole words are different.

Criminal lawyer	Barrister in criminal law
Director of religious education	Head of religious education
Elementary school teacher	Primary school teacher
Employment manager	HR manager
Governor of a state	County council chief executive
High school teacher	Secondary school teacher
Physician	Doctor
Rancher	Livestock farmer
Realtor	Estate agent
School principal	Head teacher
Special education teacher	Special needs teacher
Television announcer	TV continuity announcer
Word processor	Typist
Industrial arts	Design technology
Highway construction workers	Road construction workers
High school students	Secondary school students
